

The Declaration of Independence is a “statement of freedom.”


The Declaration of Independence said that the United States is free from Great Britain.



Thomas Jefferson was also the 3rd President of the United States. He served as President of the United States from 1801 - 1809.

The Louisiana Territory

Thomas Jefferson was president when the United States bought the Louisiana Territory from France. **The United States bought the Louisiana Territory from France in 1803.**



When Thomas Jefferson purchased the Louisiana Territory in 1803, there were only 17 states in the United States. Before Thomas Jefferson purchased the Louisiana Territory, the western border of the United States was the Mississippi River.

The Mississippi River is one of the two longest rivers in the United States.

Lewis and Clark

In 1804, two explorers named Meriwether Lewis and William Clark began exploring the Louisiana Territory. They traveled through the Louisiana Territory on the Missouri River.

They traded with American Indian tribes, like the Sioux and the Lakota, that already lived in the Louisiana Territory.


Today, **the Sioux and the Lakota are two of many American Indian tribes in the United States.**

Lewis and Clarke traveled beyond the border of the Louisiana Territory, all the way to the Pacific Ocean.

The Pacific Ocean is on the West Coast of the United States.

In 1806, Lewis and Clark traveled back across the country to Washington, D.C., which is on the East Coast of the United States. **The Atlantic Ocean is on the East Coast of the United States.**

When they arrived in Washington, D.C., they reported what they saw in the Louisiana Territory to Thomas Jefferson.

Information about the Jefferson Memorial

Construction on the Jefferson Memorial began in 1938. It was completed in 1943.

The Thomas Jefferson Memorial is located in the Tidal Basin. There are 3 other major memorials located around the Tidal Basin:


- The George Mason Memorial
